Keep your eye on the prize!




Choosing GCSE subjects





Effective revision



- ✓ Prepare as much as you can first (like cooking!)
- ✓ Ensure you have tried past papers
- ✓ Space revision out
- ✓ Focus on what you *don't know*
- ✓ Can I recall it? Do I really understand it?
- ✓ Refine your knowledge gradually
- ✓ Memorising comes last...
- ✓ Attend revision sessions/get resources/advice to assist on weak areas.

Parents/carers....

- Ask them what helps/hinders them
- Develop an agreed revision routine
- Help them get organised
- Offer treats at the end of study tasks.
- Encourage creative approaches to revision
- Support them when they say they are struggling
- Help them chart their progress
- Ask them to teach you something..
- Create opportunities for laughter!
- Tell them you love them, are proud of them and that you are in it together.









Advocate on their behalf


Avoid financial incentives
